
LIBRARY



Walk Across Oregon Challenge!

How is your walk across Oregon going? Starting this March, the Fitness Committee has been challenging city staff to put together a team of 2-4 people to "Walk Across Oregon!" With a goal of 800,000 steps per team in 30 days, or the equivalent of 400 miles.

400 miles is the approximate distance across the entire state of Oregon.

If you have a team of 4, this would be 6,667 steps each per day for 30 days. For a team of 3, it would be 8,888 steps per day. 2000 steps equals approximately 1 mile.

Finishers will have their name put in a drawing for the grand prize of Nike gift cards. The prize winners will be announced the end of April. Your team will vouch for your participation, and you can use a pedometer to track your steps. **Turn in your team names and results by April 14th** to Esther Moberg at the Library or at: emoberg@cityofseaside.us.

Alternative challenge: Limit your daily screen time (TV, Ipad, etc.) Keep track of how much time you watch TV each day for a week and then try to reduce that time by half on the second week. Third week, cut your screen time in half again, and 4th week, maintain the same amount of screen time. **Turn in your notes that you used to keep track of your screen time with your name on it to Esther Moberg at the Library or at: emoberg@cityofseaside.us, by April 14th, to put your name in the drawing for a Subway gift card.**




The City of Seaside and Seaside Police Department use Nixle alerts* to inform the community when it is necessary to get information out in a timely fashion. Nixle alerts come in the form of an SMS text message, email, or both (depending on your free subscription).



Examples of alerts include the announcement of a Tsunami warning system test, high water levels or an accident along Highway 101 that may impact travel.

Most of our unrestricted funds will help us pay for and maintain our osprey webcam in Broadway Park. Speaking of, those "seahawks" should be returning anytime. Keep your eyes peeled!

Additionally, the funds help us afford the resources needed for the watershed council to offer community outreach and education events, and they help us do fun things like provide prizes for "Free Fishing Day" in partnership with Fish and Wildlife and State Parks.


