### Reminder: Monthly Tsunami Warning System Testing in Seaside

The City of Seaside will test the Tsunami Warning System on Wednesday, February 4, 2015, beginning at 11:00 a.m. This test is conducted to monitor and assess the notification system and will not be used as a public information trial alert. The warning will begin with three beeps and consist of a voice message stating, "This is a test. This is a test of the emergency warning system. This is only a test." The message will be broadcast in English and Spanish.

This test will be conducted the first Wednesday of each month through May 2015.


### OREGON COMMUNITIES ENCOURAGED TO PARTICIPATE IN FIRE SERVICE APPRECIATION DAY

State Fire Marshal Jim Walker is encouraging communities across the state to honor the work of those in the fire service by organizing events or ceremonies for Fire Service Appreciation Day in Oregon, Tuesday, January 27, 2015.

"Communities have many opportunities to get involved and recognize the work and sacrifice of members of the Oregon fire service," says State Fire Marshal Jim Walker. "From community groups hosting a breakfast, lunch, or dinner, to schools holding essay contests, this day is an opportunity for everyone to say thanks."

In 2007, the Oregon legislature passed House Joint Resolution 25, establishing January 27 each year, as Fire Service Appreciation Day in Oregon. The Legislative Assembly encourages all Oregonians to recognize and honor fire service members for their efforts to keep our citizens safe from the ravages of fire.

Local recognition in past years included city mayors presenting fire chiefs with a certificate of thanks, fire district boards presenting commemorative coins and certificates to volunteers, newspaper articles, and special ads thanking members of the fire service, and citizens taking local firefighters to lunch.





### Seaside PD prepares for seat-belt enforcement blitz

**Seaside, Ore. – Jan. 23, 2015** – Oregon law enforcement agencies are teaming up across the State February 9-22 to put extra police officers on the road to specifically look for traffic violations. Patrol officers will be looking for seat belt and child restraint violations, using mobile devices (Cell phones) without a hands free device and speed violators.

In the 100-car surveys conducted in 2014, Seaside officers found 99% of drivers are buckling up. The goal remains to have 100% of all occupants buckling up.

Statewide, among those killed or injured were 938 child passengers under the age of eight, and a third of those were riding unrestrained or in the wrong type of safety restraint for their size. Child seats reduce the likelihood of infants under one being killed in a crash by 71 percent, and the fatal risk for toddlers age one to four by 54 percent, and 58 percent for infants and toddlers in SUVs, pickups and vans.

Oregon law requires children less than 40 pounds be restrained in a child seat. Children under the age of one or weighing less than twenty pounds must be restrained in a rear-facing child seat. A child over forty pounds must be restrained in either a child seat or a booster seat appropriate for their size until they reach age of eight or are four-feet, nine inches tall and the adult restraint system fits them correctly.

A couple rules of thumb: is the restraint going across the child's waist and NOT the abdominal area. In the event of a crash, you want the restraint to hold the child in their seat and not cut into their internal organs. Is the restraint going across the child's shoulder and NOT on their neck. We look to see if the child is elevated in the booster to the level of being able to see out the side window to give us an idea they are in a proper booster for their size.


