FIREWORKS SALES:

June 23, 2015, opened the season for fireworks sales in Oregon. Legal fireworks may be purchased only from Oregon permitted fireworks retailers and stands.

The Office of State Fire Marshal has issued more than 740 retail fireworks permits, and 131 display permits. Oregon law forbids possession, use, or sale of fireworks that fly, explode, or travel more than six feet on the ground or 12 inches in the air. Bottle rockets, Roman candles, and firecrackers are **ILLEGAL** in Oregon. All fireworks are prohibited on all Oregon beaches, in parks, and campgrounds.

Illegal fireworks can be expensive. Under Oregon law, officials may seize illegal fireworks and fine offenders up to \$500 per violation for possession of illegal fireworks and endangering life and property.

Offenders may also be arrested. Any fireworks causing damage, or misuse of fireworks carries a liability for the offender, who may be required to pay for resulting fire or other damage. Parents are liable for fireworks-caused damage by their children. Costs may include assessed fines as well as the cost of suppressing fireworks-caused fires.

Fourth of July, 'Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over'.

The Fourth of July is one of America's favorite holidays. And why not? Families and friends gather to celebrate our country with food, parades, parties, picnics, and fireworks. And yet there is a very dark side to this great holiday. For many, the celebration includes alcohol, but the holiday quickly goes from festive to fatal when people choose to drive after drinking. From 2009-2013, nearly 40 percent of ALL traffic fatalities over the Fourth of July period occurred in alcohol-impaired-driving crashes. In 2013, *Forbes* magazine named the Independence Day holiday "the most dangerous holiday of the year." Over the Fourth of July holiday period in 2013 alone (6 p.m. July 3 to 5:59 a.m. July 8), there were 199 people killed in alcohol-impaired-driving crashes on our nation's roads.

To crack down on drunk driving this Fourth of July, law enforcement will be out in full force, aggressively targeting those who put lives in danger. This Fourth of July holiday, you can show your patriotism by helping to make Seaside roads safer for everyone. Remember to *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over*. It is as simple as that.

Seaside Police Department recommends these simple tips to prevent drunk driving.

- Plan a safe way home before the fun begins.
- Before drinking, designate a sober driver.
- If you're impaired, use a taxi, call a sober friend or family member, or use public transportation.
- If you happen to see a drunk driver on the road, don't hesitate to dial 911.
- If you know someone who is about to drive or ride while impaired, take your friend's keys and help your friend make other arrangements to get to where he or she is going safely.




LIBRARY

No Illegal Fireworks

\$700 Fine

City Ordinance 131.11

Illegal fireworks explode, eject balls of fire, fly into the air, or travel more than six feet on the ground or 12 inches into the air.

TENTS PROHIBITED



No Camping

\$700 Fine

City Ordinance 93.01(d)

Enclosed structures are prohibited on the beach. Day or overnight camping prohibited.

DIGGING LARGE PITS PROHIBITED

Maximum Fine \$700

City Ordinance 96.23

Fires greater than 3'x3'x3' are prohibited

PALLETS PROHIBITED

Maximum Fine \$700

2015 FIRE SEASON RESTRICTIONS**

Fire Season declared at 01:00 am, June 16, 2015

The following Guidelines have been adopted and will be followed for burning within Clatsop County during fire season.

CLOSURE OF ALL OPEN DEBRIS BURNING, EXCEPT:

- 1. Burn barrels allowed, Permits Required:** metal barrels in good condition, heavy mesh screens (1/4 mesh or less), available water supply and hand tools required. **Daylight to 10:00 am ONLY.**

- 2. Recreational fires are allowed under the following guidelines:**
 - a. At designated campsites, personal residence, or beaches.
 - b. No closer than 50 feet from dune grass and 15 feet from any structure.
 - c. No fires allowed in drift wood.
 - d. Clear of all combustibles (brush, grass, etc.) 5 feet around and 10 feet above.
 - e. Maximum fire size is 3 feet in diameter and 2 feet in height.
 - f. Maximum fire **pit** size is 4 feet in diameter and must be at least 12 inches high.
 - g. Must be attended at all times
 - h. Must be completely extinguished prior to leaving.
 - i. May not be allowed during periods of extreme fire conditions (i.e. – high winds, low humidity, extended periods without moisture, etc.).
 - j. **Permits Required** for permanent or temporary recreational fires






