### Reminder: Monthly Tsunami Warning System Testing in Seaside

The City of Seaside will test the Tsunami Warning System on Wednesday, April 1, 2015, beginning at 11:00 a.m. This test is conducted to monitor and assess the notification system and will not be used as a public information trial alert. The warning will begin with three beeps and consist of a voice message stating, "This is a test. This is a test of the emergency warning system. This is only a test." The message will be broadcast in English and Spanish.

This test will be conducted the first Wednesday of each month through May 2015.

## FIRE DEPARTMENT

This coming Sunday, March 8, 2015, marks the beginning of Daylight Saving Time and serves as a good reminder for Oregonians to test their smoke alarms. The Office of State Fire Marshal is urging residents to test their smoke alarms before automatically changing the batteries.

"Smoke alarm technology has advanced and many now come with 10-year batteries and some are tamper-resistant," said State Fire Marshal Jim Walker. "So, I encourage residents to test their alarms before changing the battery."

Oregon law requires ionization-only smoke alarms that are solely battery powered to come equipped with a hush feature and a 10-year battery.

Because of this technology, the national slogan "Change your clock, Change your battery" may not apply to Oregon residents who have these ionization-only smoke alarms. Other types of alarms are also being sold with either a 10-year battery or a standard-life battery. "Ensuring you have working smoke alarms in your home is the single most important step you can take to increase your family's safety from a home fire," adds Walker. "Also, be sure to replace any smoke alarm that is 10 years old or older."

To test your alarm properly we recommend you:

- 1) Push the test button to be sure the battery is working.
- 2) When replacing batteries, follow the manufacturer's instructions for the correct battery to use.
- 3) Always retest alarms after installing new batteries
- 4) Replace any alarm that fails to operate after installing a new battery.
- 5) Inspect your alarms to determine if they are 10 years old or older, and replace any smoke alarm 10 years old or older. Look for a date on the back of the alarm. If there is no date, your alarm is more than 10 years old and should be replaced.
- 6) Follow the manufacturer's instructions on regularly cleaning your alarms of dust and cobwebs.

Working smoke alarms provide a critical early warning to a fire, allowing you vital minutes to escape, which increase your chances of survival.

Additional safety tips:

- \* Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, in each bedroom, and outside each sleeping area.
- \* Never disconnect or remove batteries from smoke alarms for other uses.
- \* Use the smoke alarm's hush feature to silence nuisance alarms.
- \* Make a home fire escape plan and practice it with family members.

# GOT SMOKE ALARMS?

**IF YOU RENT**  
*AND do not have working smoke alarms, contact your landlord or property manager.*

**FOR RENT**

**HOW OLD IS YOUR ALARM?**  
**SMOKE ALARMS** that are **10** years old or older should be *replaced*.

**1/2** OF HOME FIRE DEATHS happened in homes without a **WORKING** smoke alarm.

**PROPERLY INSTALLED & MAINTAINED SMOKE ALARMS SAVE LIVES** AND PROTECT AGAINST INJURY AND LOSS DUE TO FIRE. FOR INCREASED PROTECTION, **INSTALL A SMOKE ALARM** ON EVERY LEVEL OF YOUR HOME, OUTSIDE **SLEEPING AREAS** (HALLWAY), AND IN EACH BEDROOM.



**DOES YOUR ALARM WORK?**  
**TEST** your smoke alarm **ONCE A MONTH** using the **TEST BUTTON**.

**SMOKE FROM A FIRE SPREADS FAST AND IS DEADLY.**  
Working smoke alarms give early warning so you can get outside *quickly* and *escape* to your meeting place.

A common reason for a non-functioning smoke alarm is that people disable it after a false alarm. If a smoke alarm alerts (or sounds) and there is not a fire (i.e., burnt toast), **PUSH THE HUSH BUTTON. DO NOT REMOVE THE BATTERY.** Open the windows or doors to clear out the smoke.




This training meets the education requirements for those applying for a commission. Current notaries are also encouraged to attend and refresh your memory and learn new content, as well.


